This week we learned all about the letter "I". Our story this week was called <u>Iquana on Ice</u>. This story gave us the opportunity to practice making the long and short sounds for letter "I". Throughout the week we also learned about the number "6". We practiced writing the number, counting to "6", filling in our tenframe with 6 orange dots, and drawing a group of 6 tallies.

During circle time we learned about different animals that live in the forest. We learned that during the fall a lot of animals prepare for the cold winter. During fall, animals such as bears and hedgehogs, prepare to hibernate (sleep for a long time) and eat lots of food. During our craft time we had the opportunity to make a hibernating bear sleeping in a pile of leaves and a grey squirrel with a bushy tail!
